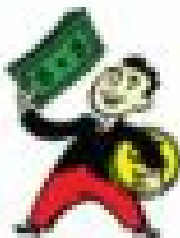

Money Saving Tips for Winterizing Your Home

- **Seal Off Windows and Doors:** Drafts enter your home through openings around windows and doors. Do a walk-through of your home and check for any drafts. **For drafts around the edges of windows, apply a small amount of caulk or door sweeps for drafts around doors.** Garages tend to hold cold air, so pay close attention entryways from the garage.
- **Adjust Your Thermostat:** If 70 degrees is a comfortable temperature for you, try lowering it to 68. Wear warmer clothes and add extra blankets at night. The key is to **find a temperature you can live with without discomfort** or a disruption in your day.
- **Service Your Heating System:** Maintain a regular service schedule for your heating systems to ensure they work at optimal levels. **Keep your furnace unblocked, change your filters regularly, and keep it clean of dust and debris.** If you have a **wood burning heater**, keep the flue vent on a regular cleaning program. The inside of the appliance can be cleaned with a wire brush.
- **Use a Humidifier:** Since **moist air holds heat better**, a humidifier is perfect for those winter months. This should help offset the lower temperatures as a result of you turning the thermostat down.
- **Invest in a Water Heater Cover:** If your water heater emits heat, invest in an insulating blanket. **If heat dissipates out of the unit, your water heater will work harder and use more energy.** The cover is a great preventative.

- **Keep Exhaust Fans Turned Off:** Exhaust fans blow moist and hot air out of your home, which could be used to heat your home. For your next shower, consider leaving the door open. ***This will allow the warm air to naturally flow throughout your home.***
- **Set Your Ceiling Fans Clockwise:** Clockwise traps the heat inside, allowing for warmer temperatures. Set your ceiling fan to low, which circulates the hot air down into your home.
- **Don't Forget the Fireplace:** When in use, your fireplace is a great tool for fighting the cold. But, when at rest, it can be a be like an open window. ***Here are a few things you can do to winterize your fireplace:***
 - When not in use, keep your fireplace damper closed to prevent your heated air from going up the chimney.
 - If you have a firebox, avoid heat loss by opening the dampers while a fire is going.
 - Invest in a heat-air exchange system which circulates warm air back into your home.
 - Ensure the seal around the flue damper is secure.
 - If your fireplace is never used, plug and seal the chimney flue.
